

Following a very successful reunion to celebrate the 35th Anniversary of HMS Fulmar being handed over to the RAF over the weekend of 22/24th June 2007 it was decided that we would proceed with the formation of an independent association away from the Buccaneer association who had organized the 2007 event. This would then open up the membership criteria to anyone who had served at Fulmar in any capacity at any time. As the attendance at the 2007 event was just over 220 it was felt that this was enough of a start to begin to recruit and build up a membership database. With the FAABA members who has served at Lossiemouth included, the membership potential was already in excess of 300 people. At the time of writing we have three people willing to take the idea forward but we are looking for more volunteers to act as committee members and take the Association on to greater times.

Hughie Williams who lives in Elgin will act as Chairman and Treasurer. Jimmy Gardiner, also in Elgin will act as General Secretary and Social Secretary Dave Clark of the FAABA has agreed to act as Membership Secretary, FAABA liaison and the FNF Representative. Living in Somerset at present thus ideally situated for the Yeovil based FAABA liaison and FNF Representative

These posts along with all others will be put up for election at the first AGM proper. It is anticipated that this will be held on the Saturday morning of the 2012 reunion weekend, venue and time tba.

It was proposed at the 2007 reunion that another be organised in 2012 which is the 40th anniversary of the station being handed over to the RAF. At that time it also coincided with the date set for a Royal Navy presence to return to the area as part of the JSF Squadrons. This unfortunately has been delayed and no firm date is now available, although 2014 is the current thinking for the advance party. But the 2012 Reunion will take place and dialogue will soon be opened with the WO&SNCO's Mess at Lossiemouth with a view to getting a firm date hopefully in June. It is anticipated that, subject to RAF approval that the format be the same as before with a relaxed casual Meet and Greet on the Friday evening and a more formal Black Tie Dinner on the Saturday evening. The format for the Saturday will be similar to last time with a initial tot and cocktail reception, the main meal then followed by a casino and music. The limit set by the RAF for the function was 240

places and demand is expected to be high – though all committee members and guests are guaranteed a seat!!!

So please register your interest as soon as possible, the total going will, to some degree dictate the price and complimentary drinks. The weekend event cost £40 per place in 2007 so I would anticipate it costing £50 this time around. (This also included a Friday evening meal which was excellent value)

Membership Secretary's Report

The HMS Fulmar membership list currently stands at 240 names although many members of the FAABA who have not specifically asked to be included on the list are eligible to become members. At this time we are not asking for subscriptions as the FAABA have a small amount of money allocated to the organization of the 2012 event and it is planned that the weekend be self financing with any profits being put behind the bar for "Toofers" Thus as things stand we have a potential database of just over 350 names. Add to this the WRNS Association members, (we had about 20 last time) you will all see there is likely to be some competition for places. Places will therefore be allocated on a first come basis from the announcement date which will be advised in the Navy News, Northern Scott, the FAAA and RNA, and to the FNF membership at the same time. Notification of intent will not guarantee a place, receipt of applications with cheque will!

A reserve list will be created as it is anticipated that like the last time some people had to drop out for personal reasons. As long as we can backfill the places all money will be refunded in full. So please can you all rack your brains, look out your old address books, visit Friends Reunited etc etc and find as many of your old shipmates as you can.
