

This stone is dedicated to the service and civilian personnel who served, fought and in some cases died at the Royal Naval Air Station on this site between 1939 and 1996.

During WWII this airfield was attacked several times by enemy aircraft suffering damage and casualties. Notably it played a critical part in the allied success with air operations on D-Day in 1944.
